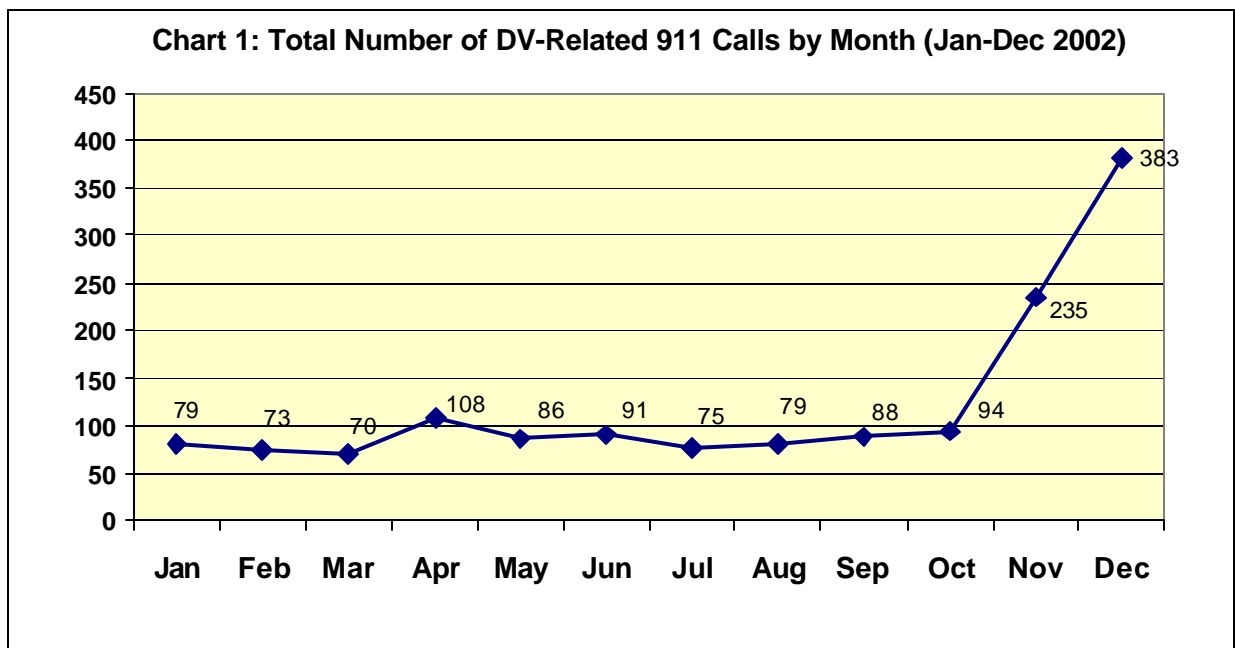
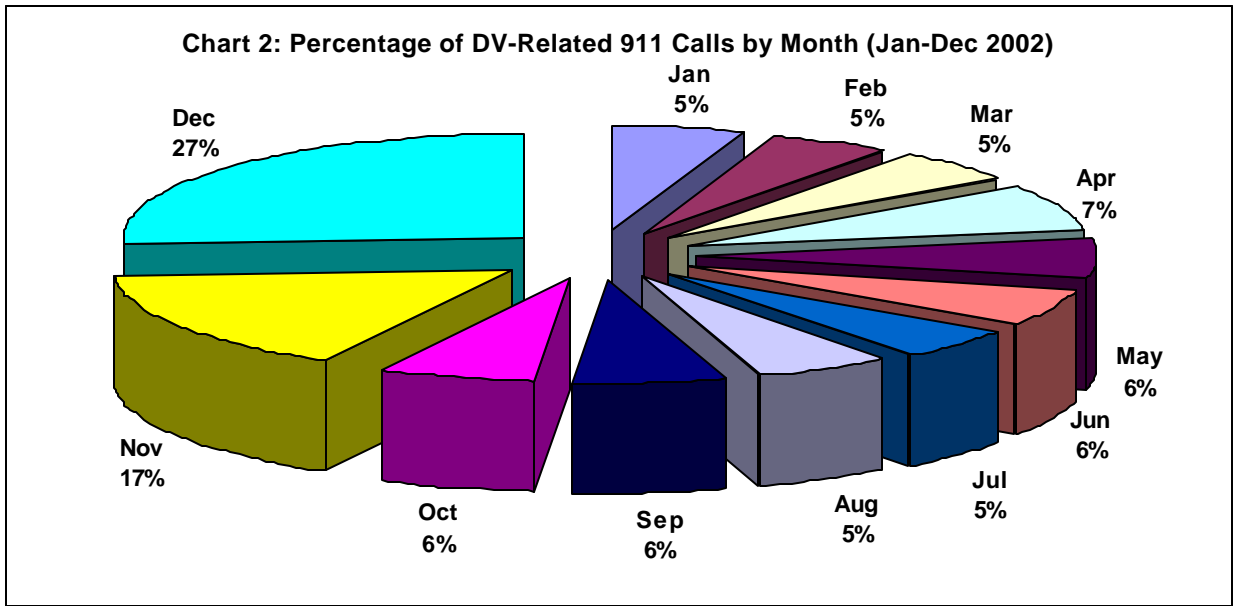


Data Summary - Emergency (911) Call Data

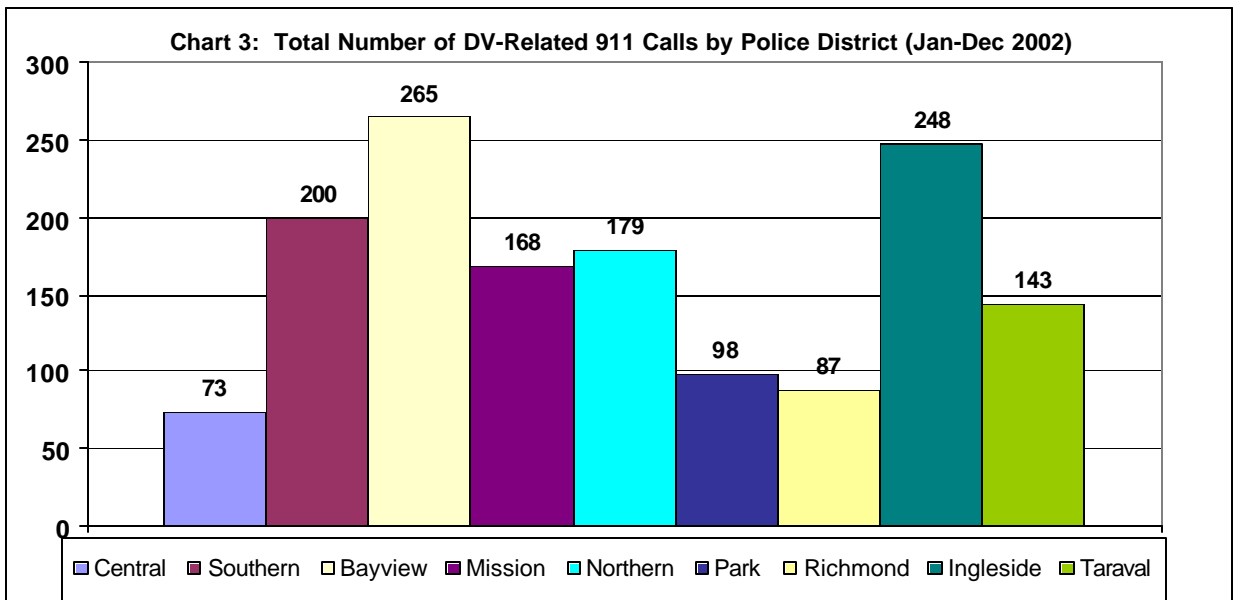
The charts below present data collected by the San Francisco Emergency Communications Department reflecting the number of domestic violence (DV)-related calls made to 911 during 2002. Note that the increases in November and December should not be construed as an indication of an increase in DV-related calls; rather it is the effects of training that was offered to call operators in November, 2002 to allow better tracking of DV-related calls. Additional tracking should be carried out over a longer period of time to capture a more accurate representation of DV-related calls. Nevertheless, the three to five-fold increase in the proportion of DV-related calls after training suggests a dramatic re-conceptualization of the actual number of DV-related cases in San Francisco.



A total of 1,461 DV-related calls were made to 911 for 2002, registering an average of 122 calls per month.



An average 8.33% of calls made to 911 for 2002 were DV-related calls.



Among the nine police districts in San Francisco, Bayview (18%) and Ingleside (17%) registered the highest number of DV-related 911 calls.
